How is Our School Development Plan Used?

- Guides ongoing assessment and review of goals and actions.
- Our school development plan is the driver for closing learning gaps and informs:
 - Instructional strategies
 - Professional learning
 - School structures and processes for learning
 - Resources to improve student learning
 - Data-informed decision making



School Development Plan – School Goal

- Students' foundational skills in literacy will improve.

School Development Plan Outcome:

- Students will improve in reading (word reading, phonological awareness, phonics) through explicit, systematic instruction.



School Development Plan – Outcome Measures



- Provincial Assessments
- Report Card Data
- Student perception data from surveys (system and school based)



School Development Plan – Data for Monitoring Progress

- Words Their Way Spelling Inventory
- Teacher perception data
- Bi-weekly check-ins



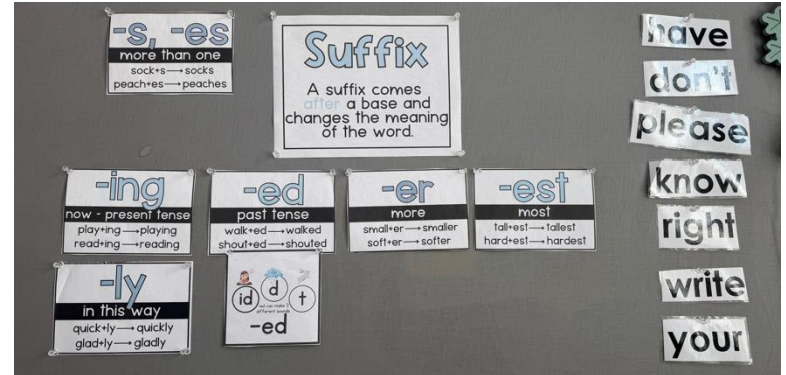
School Development Plan – Actions

■ Learning Excellence

- Provide daily structured and explicit instruction
- Connect decodable text to concepts that are taught
- Strategically teach high-frequency words
- Build, model and use sound walls, mnemonic alphabet, anchor charts

School Development Plan – Actions



■ Well-being

- Use of goal-setting and self-assessment
- Clearly display learning expectations for all learners (learning intentions and success criteria, co-creation)
- Utilize flexible groupings for specific learning needs

■ Truth & Reconciliation, Diversity and Inclusion

- Know learners cultural background, life experiences and learning needs
- Provide access to inclusive, diverse and inviting texts

- Student awareness and use of self-regulation strategies will improve.

School Development Plan – Actions



■ Learning Excellence

- Model acknowledgement of emotions as first step in problem-solving
- Direct instruction regarding brain development and how a regulated stress-response affects student well-being and achievement
- Role playing to practice problem solving skills before a problem arises

School Development Plan – Actions



■ Professional Learning

- Professional learning for teachers/whole-school implementation of the Collaborative for Academic, Social and Emotional Learning (CASEL)

■ Structures and Processes

- Designated time and space for practicing of regulation skills
 - Sensory Room
 - SEL Routines
 - Collaborative Response
 - SLTs
 - IPPs and SSPs focused on regulation and/or problem-solving strategies

Our School Budget

- Our school received \$1,352,491 in 2025-26 to provide a quality education to our students and meet the goals in our school development plan (SDP).
- At least 75 per cent of budgeted funds covers **staffing** and the remaining portion covers instructional and operational **supplies**.

- Our student enrolment for the current year is 175 (was 184 last year).
